Schwab will publish a revised trading schedule for any future National Day of Mourning as soon as it is declared by the exchanges.

** NYSE will be open, but the Bond Markets will be closed.

*** The NYSE, NYSE AMEX and NASDAQ will close trading early (at 1:00 PM ET) on Thursday, July 3, 2025 (the day before Independence Day), Friday, November 28, 2025 (the day after Thanksgiving) and Wednesday, December 24, 2025 (the day before Christmas). Crossing Session orders will be accepted beginning at 1:00 p.m. for continuous executions until 1:30 p.m. on these dates. All times are Eastern Time.
